

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College Production – Wow! What an event!!!



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Prep Sounds in Focus

The Prep sounds in focus revolve around the digraph 'th'. In English we use these letters to make two sounds, the voice 'th' as in 'this' (You can feel the vibration in the throat) and the unvoiced 'th' as in 'with' (Air moving moving across the tongue). It is essential that students use the 'th' rather than substituting it with the 'f', which can be common practice with some younger children.

Prep Words To Fluency

The Sounds to fluency are 'are and 'was'. The holidays would be a great opportunity to practise the high frequency word list in your child's Reading Log. For some children, it can take 200+ repetitions of a word for it to become part of their long term memory.

Reading Hints

Please keep the reading going during the holidays. Our students have made some incredible gains over the last three Terms and we want to maintain the momentum. Remember, two especially important skills are self- monitoring and self-correction, and reading for meaning and information (comprehension). With fine weather, consider taking the opportunity to take a book outside and enjoy the moment, visiting the Bendigo Goldfields library and/ or visiting a book shop. Reading is for life.

LODDON YOUTH HEALTH EXPO “HEAD TO TOE HEALTH”

Around 150 young people in Years 9 and 10 from the regions schools will gather in Boort on Tuesday, 17th of October for the Biannual Loddon Youth Health Expo.

The Expo in its 8th cycle, provides the opportunity for Loddon youth to not only hear the latest health information and to encourage positive decision making but to also explore career choices and to ensure awareness of the local services available to them.

This year’s Expo will feature key note speaker, Sonia Karras from Whole New World. Sonia will share her vast knowledge in the area of drugs, alcohol, keeping safe and celebrating safely, she has a unique, no nonsense and humorous approach which leaves her audiences informed, entertained and with memories that will stay with them for years to come. Sonia has 10 years experience in the Hospitality Industry and almost 13 years presenting her award winning program.

Following Sonia’s presentation, local service providers will provide a range of workshops on mental health, relationships, healthy eating and food choices and career decision making.

The event is a partnership between local schools and services, including Northern District Community Health, Inglewood and Districts Health Service, Loddon Shire Council and School Nurses from the Department of Education. The Loddon Shire, Bendigo Bank, Cardboard Cartons and Inglewood and District Health Service have provided vital sponsorship this year.

Students are attending from Boort District School, Wedderburn Secondary College, East Loddon p-12 and Pyramid Hill p-10.

Permission forms have been sent home with all Years 9 and 10 students. Lunch and buses will be provided free of charge and students are expected to wear comfortable, casual clothing to enable participation in the activities.

NATIONAL TREE PLANTING DAY –

Year 9’s have been learning about global warming, the causes and the devastating effects it has had. As a fitting conclusion to the unit of work, it was decided to take up the opportunity of hosting a National Tree Planting Day at school. Over a period of 2 weeks the Year 9’s in small groups completed various tasks. These included liaising with a primary class in order to teach them about the importance of trees to help reduce greenhouse gases, mapping out areas which could be planted, selecting plants, digging holes, fittings tree guards and planting and watering trees.
