Former Y12s return & Elevate Education visit: Six of our former students returned to share some tips and advice about how to survive that final part of Year 12 and also what life was like since leaving school. The session started with a presenter from Elevate Education speaking to students about the 'race to the finish line'. Nandana offered advice to students regarding routines during the holidays and once classes finish, through to advice about wellbeing, and studying. My favourite tip related to identifying your weaknesses (within subjects) and selecting practice questions that target this specifically. Plus of course my old favourite asking your teachers for help and seeking feedback on practice exam questions.

Following the Elevate Education session Montana, Alicia,

Colby, Ciaran, Levi and Brodie all arrived with beaming smiles. It was so lovely to see the former students (now either working full time or studying full time in Ballarat, Bendigo and / or Melbourne). There was such a



positive energy in the room as I interviewed students (very informally) about challenges of Y12, challenges since leaving school, strategies for success in terms of study and any other life advice students had to offer. Each of the former students

spoke with genuine care and enthusiasm, keen to provide as much advice as they could. They encouraged students to utilise revision booklets (consider specifically what you need to know eg Key Skills and Key Knowledge), practice exam questions, seek teacher feedback, set limits, take a break and have some nice rewards to look forward to after exams. I'm really proud of these former students, to see them not quite 12 months on from leaving school each doing so well, following their career dreams and pathways, offering mature advice yet also encouraging a balance truly made me so happy.

Y9&10 Outdoor Ed camp: students travelled to Mansfield, where we camped two nights to enable us to travel to Mt Buller for a day of skiing or snow boarding on Tuesday. Whilst it was cold students soon adapted and gave it a real crack. It was great to see students persevering, pushing themselves to try and control their speed and direction on the slopes. We had the pleasure
