Let's Call It Out! Racism is Racism!

We are ashamed to report that in this day and age, members of the school community try to defend blatant racism as being a 'joke' or just 'casual language'. Enough is enough; it is time to call this out! We talk all of the time about everybody's right to feel safe at school (and within the wider community) and the fact is that many students, staff and community members do not. If you are starting sentences with 'I'm not racist but...' or finishing sentences with 'but I was only joking' then you are part of what we see clearly as a problem.

What may seem something small or insignificant to you, can be a massive thing to others. Comments can have a devastating and long-lasting impact on individuals, their families and friends. This is simply not ok!

Throughout this past week, the college has had 3 very significant things take place that are clearly racist against our indigenous friends. We have also this year had significant language, gestures, comments and the like made in a way which is clearly homophobic, sexist and/or antisemitic. On occasions there is no doubt that these are deliberate and when questioned, comments are often backed up as being 'just a bit of 'fun'.

We hope that parents, carers and college community members will join us in drawing a line in the sand. Let's be courageous enough to call this type of behaviour out. It is appalling and not the sort of thing that we want associated with our college!

Production – Tickets now on sale!

With one week to go until the college production of Matilda, all families are reminded of the information shared in past newsletters regarding times, tickets, costumes, and food and drinks available. A reminder that all students from P-12 have a role (on or off the stage) and are expected to attend both shows.

Show times:

- Matinee to begin at 12.30pm. Audience members may enter the gym from 12.10pm. A strict 12.30pm start time applies to ensure the show concludes with time for students to change and board buses home at the end of the day.
- Leading cast members and some other senior school students will be asked to stay behind at school that afternoon (a note will go home shortly for these students). All other students will board the bus home and cannot be supervised at school.

Evening performance to begin at 6pm. All students are required back at school to get changed and ready no later than 5.40pm. Audience members may enter the gym from 5.45pm.

Tickets:

Tickets are available through the college office or at the door on the night. Cash and EFTPOS excepted.
 Adults \$10 each, children 5yo and over \$5 (East Loddon students do not require a ticket).

Costumes:

- Costumes are required to school no later than Thu 31st August and will be left at school for dress rehearsals next week. On the day of the production, students will come to school in uniform and will get changed into their costumes prior to the performance. Prior to the evening performance, students will change into their costumes at school.
- **Prep:** casual clothing (no logos or pictures)
- Year 1-2: Grey leggings/shorts/tracksuit pants and a white or grey plain T-shirt (no logos or pictures)
- Year 3-11: White shirt, grey shorts/skirt/pants (no logos or pictures)
- Year 12: casual clothing (themselves as parents (no large logos or pictures)

 All: usual school shoes, ankle socks (if wearing longer socks, they must be white or grey)

Food and drinks available:

- The Matinee performance will NOT feature an intermission. A short 5-minute break may occur (time permitting) but there will be no food or drinks available.
- Leanne Welsh and crew will be running a coffee van prior to the evening performance and during the intermission, with hot drinks and Leanne's famous lamb and vegie soup available to purchase.

Our Senior VM students will also be running a stall before the evening show and during the intermission, selling cold drinks and theatre snacks.
