More Ag in Middle Years

Exciting changes are coming to the Middle Years curriculum for next year! In an effort to provide a more structured program, the 5/6 classes will now have two Science lessons and one Aariculture lesson. Previously, teachers would try to incorporate aspects of Agriculture into their Science lessons, but this new approach will allow students to delve deeper into the important subject.

Another change is that the Year 8 Community subject will be replaced by a semester of Agriculture in the Technology rotation. This will give students the chance to experience different Technology options before choosing electives in Year 9. It's a fantastic way for students to explore various Technology pathways and make more informed decisions about future studies.

Introducing Agriculture as a separate subject and incorporating it into the Technology rotation will provide students with a well-rounded education that prepares them for the changing world. In addition to its importance as an industry, Agriculture teaches valuable skills such as problem-solving, critical thinking, and practical application of knowledge.

We are confident that these changes will enhance the learning experience for our students and provide them with a solid foundation in important subjects. We look forward to implementing these updates and seeing the positive impact they have on our students' education
