## From the Principal

### College's New Mental Health Practitioner

### Recent PD—Cyber Safety

Myself, Mr Wilkinson and Ms Harrington attended a recent PD in Bendigo with members of the Department of Education, DFFH, Victoria Police and other local agencies. The PD was very informative with regard to our obligations in reporting student safety concerns and we learnt a great deal about our requirements re mandatory reporting.

As part of the PD, we also listened to a presentation on Cybersafety by Susan McClean. The session was extremely informative and also a little confronting at times. Key notes out of this PD regarding cybersafety, were in regards to the importance of adhering to age restrictions on apps, the importance of knowing what your child/ren are doing online and the key point that 'There is no such thing as an online friend'. If your child has a friend online that they do not physically know, then please encourage them to block or delete this person!

### Building Works Update

I am really happy to report that the temp fencing for our relocatable building was erected yesterday. We again have 'workers' onsite today to

begin some of the underground service work and we are on-track to have our relocatable building delivered next Wednesday, complete with 5 trucks and a crane onsite. For those who are unaware, the relocatable building will consist of two large rooms that will be utilised by senior classes during our stage 2 building works program.

Speaking of our stage 2 building works, it was confirmed yesterday that this has now gone out to tender, with the project likely to begin towards the latter part of this term. These works will see the entire Art, Tech, Science wing of the college demolished or refurbished.

## Literacy & Numeracy

Our grade 5 and 6 students are currently studying the novel 'One Crazy Summer' using Doug Lemov's "Teach Like a Champion" (TLAC) approach.

The students all have their own novel which allows them to practice annotating and writing notes in the margins.

These units set up and reinforce important background knowledge. In 'One Crazy Summer', the kids are learning about political and social change of the 1960s and in particular key people and events of the American Civil Rights Movement. This knowledge is developed with a Knowledge Organiser and is practiced regularly through the unit to get this information into students' long-term memory. In the meantime, it helps them understand and comprehend nuances of the book as they are reading which allows them to make sophisticated and relevant inferences.

The class works through the novel with a combination of the teacher reading and the students taking a turn. This supports all students to access the same novel and the same important cultural knowledge.

Teachers are finding that students are more confident to take a turn reading and more confident to share their ideas in discussions and written tasks.

### 9/10 table tennis

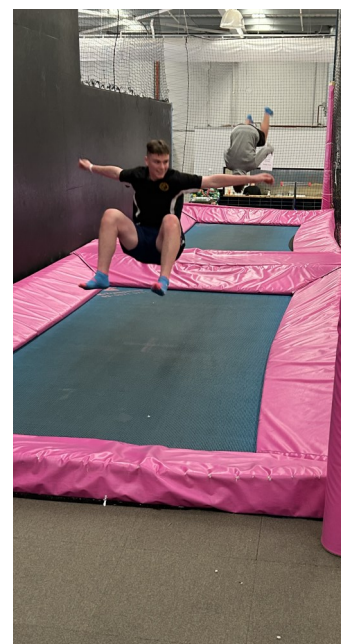
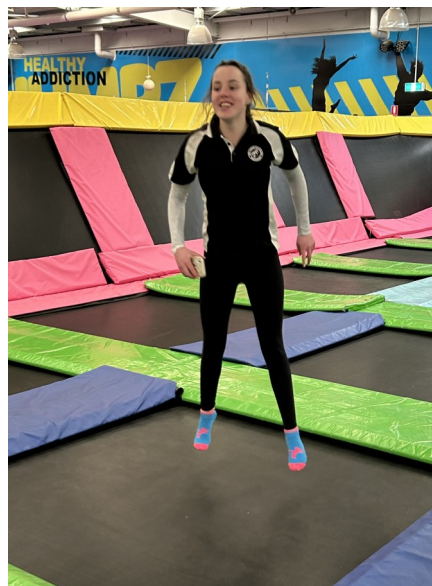
