We All Have A Right To Feel Safe At School...

At East Loddon P-12 College we aim to provide a safe space for everyone from students, to staff, to parents and other family members. In order to do this successfully, we need to have discussions with stake-holders from time to time that remind everyone that we all have the right to feel 'safe'.

For me, 'safe' takes into account both physical and emotional aspects and not what we 'believe' someone should feel, but how they 'actually do' feel.

I believe that our college is a safe school, but I also believe that it could be a lot safer for all. A genuine acceptance and respect for all would be terrific and I am sure that we are continuing to get closer to this each day.

No student, staff member or college family member should feel threatened or unsafe on our college grounds at all.

Respectful conversation and interaction is to be strongly encouraged at all times and individuals should feel comfortable to be themselves and to 'stand-up' if they feel that they need to.

I am not proud to say that we have again uncovered some behaviours this week that contradict our college values, but I will certainly not shy away from the fact that we have disrespectful interactions from time to time. We have uncovered racist, anti-semitic and vulgar comments/interactions this week and to be frank, THIS IS NOT OK. Please have a chat with your child/ren about the topic of safety this week and see what they can tell you about this. In a lot of cases, our children are well and truly ahead of the pack when it comes to safety and the acceptance of others.

Students in our year 5/6 class today discussed the topic of safety, with one very wise student raising a really good point with me afterwards. This point was around 'what we say and what we really mean'. This discussion was with a 12 year old student who was able to critically question the impact of peers and adult family members words on individuals. They mentioned that comments such as -

- No offense but...
- Don't worry it was just a joke...
- I'm not racist but...
- Not to be mean, but...

Are not helpful and are clearly not honest.

This particular student and I wonder how many of our newsletter readers could make a concerted effort to change at least one interaction this week. This might be in the form of respectfully challenging a comment that is clearly hurtful to someone else, or changing the way in which you handle a situation. See how you go...

Spotlight on Year 10

Our Year 10 class currently has 22 students in one group and 3 students in the VM course. We will spotlight the VM group in a future newsletter.

All of the year 10s have to make the important decision about which courses they will study for the next two years. It is a big transition and it is coming up quickly. As part of their preparation for subject selections, guest speakers from La Trobe Uni and Bendigo TAFE have visited the last two Mondays. In their next lesson, Mrs Krahe will present information about the VCE/VM pathways and subject selection interviews will commence next week.



In English, they are studying persuasive writing and producing their own convincing arguments about whether or not debutante balls should be discontinued.

In Humanities, they are investigating the causes and consequences of WWII: including Kododa, the home front.

In PE, they are competing their High Jump competition.

In Advance, they are working on community projects.

In Science, they are planting trees with the Grade 3 & 4's for Tree planting day / Science Week.

In some pretty disappointing news, I had a visit from the bus company that operates the majority of our buses yesterday. They reported to me a number of issues that are costing them significant amounts of money. This year they have spent over \$2500 making repairs to buses that only our children use. This came as a bit of a shock to be honest. Some of the repairs were for regular wear and tear but I was shown photographs of chair stitching that had been deliberately unpicked by some of our kids. This is pretty embarrassing and certainly does not follow our big blue R of **RESPECT**. I have met with our senior and junior bus captain today and asked them to reiterate these simple rules.

1. Students are to sit in their allocated seats. This way there is no question about when damage has occurred and who caused the damage.

2. Students are not to eat on the bus. Full stop.
3. Students are to wear seatbelts if they are fitted.

If you have a child in the senior part of the school, they will find this difficult. We have it on good authority (our littlest informants tell us), that 'the big kids don't wear their seatbelts', 'the big kids eat on the bus'. They say that, because it is true. Know this, it's a big job being a role model. So you might as well be good at it. Students not doing the right thing will be reported to the office by bus captains or the little kids and we will then need to deal with it. We are better than this. Please feel free to tell me if you have any word on the culprits of the vandalised seats.
