Cyber-Safety Sessions

On Tuesday of this week, the college was fortunate to have Allie from Mallee Family Care Community Legal Centre come to the college to deliver cybersafety sessions to students from Prep to year 10. I sat in on all sessions in order to ensure that I was up to date with the messages that our students were being delivered and I found the sessions to be very relevant. The key messages of all sessions revolved around 'safety' and 'speaking up to a trusted adult' if a student comes across concerning content online.

Key messages I took from the sessions were based around the importance of setting up rules for technology use in the home, the potential dangers in 'online worlds' with regards to websites and apps that have age restrictions and/or offers of 'free' gifts and game credits, as well as the key point once again that THERE IS NO SUCH THING AS AN ONLINE FRIEND. Students in the middle and

senior schools were also briefed on the importance of seeking permission and consent before posting any images of others online, and were made aware of the dangers and potential ramifications around spreading online rumours and sharing images of themselves and/or others.

I encourage all parents and carers of Prep to year 10 students to have a chat with their child about online safety and see what some of the key messages were that they took from these cybersafety sessions.

I do not write this next comment to alarm parents or carers, but I think it would be quite concerning for many of you to understand just what can and does happen online. Our children have access to so many wonderful and not so wonderful things online and in many instances, our children will know more than us when it comes to online technologies. I believe that it is really important for us to have open lines of communication with our children with regards to technology. I also believe that it is important for us as adults and parents/carers to have a greater and more up-to-date understanding of the online world. The college is currently looking to get an expert in this field to come and present to staff and parents/carers before the end of the year.

But, sometimes NOT, perhaps unknowingly drawn into 'dark' and unsafe places?

How can we help keep our young people safe online?

Do we know what our kids can view online at any time?

Our P-10 students received important CYBER-Safety reminders this week following sessions presented to each year level by Allie from Mallee Family Care/Community Legal Centre.

Topics ranged from being kind & safe online (for our younger students), to legalities around sharing intimate images and laws around sexual consent, (for our older students).

Key message/recommendations for all families-

- 1. Be kind and share online
- 2. No screens in the bedroom
- 3. No devices at the dinner table
- 4. Use devices in shared spaces
- 5. Ask a trusted adult first to go online
- 6. Don't share private information eg- your name, address, where you go to school etc
- 7. There is no such thing as an 'online friend' (need to know them in person)

8. Online bullying – mean or abusive text messages, spreading rumours, making up fake profiles are all bullying and this can be illegal

9. Legalities around intimate image sharing and sexual consent. Eg- It is illegal to share nude pics with others.
